The 2006 subject theme is: Law and Order in the Gold Rush - Crime, Courts, Punishment

The deadline to submit essays is February 15, 2006. The award will be presented to the winner at the annual dinner of the Sacramento Pioneer Association in late March.

Present a title. Essay must be double spaced and typed with a 1-inch margin surrounding printing. You may use the MLA essay format. Maximum words 1000. While you are encouraged to create a fictional piece rather than a report, the work must be based on fact and show evidence of research. Please append a bibliography.
